RCIA – For Children RITES OF ACCEPTANCE November 6, 2011

Sunday November 6th, our parish community will experience the **Rite of Acceptance into the Order of the Catechumens** at Our Lady of the Holy Rosary as part of the Sunday liturgy. These rites have a rich history within our Church based on the process that some of the earliest Christians used when people came to them asking to be baptized.

When the RCIA Team believes an unbaptized Inquirer is starting to show some signs of a Christian faith and they have verbalized a readiness to commit to becoming Catholic, they are invited to celebrate a ritual called the **Rite of Acceptance into the Order of the Catechumens**. After this rite, as an official member of the Church, the person receives an official title and role to play in the Church, that of “catechumen” which means “one in whom the Word of God echoes”.

As a parish community, we act to support the catechumens and candidates on their journey of faith. Several symbols used in the rites remind us of our faith and the rich tradition of our Church.

The Threshold

The door or threshold of the Church is an important symbol in many Catholic rites. Doors symbolize transitions and new ways of life. In the **Rite of Acceptance**, the unbaptized wishing to answer God’s call are met at the threshold of the Church by the baptized faithful and are ritually welcomed to enter into the Church’s doors.

The Cross

To enter into Christ also means entering into His dying and rising. Those who answer God’s call will need to learn how to let go and die in their old ways of life which may at times be difficult and painful. However, the cross is also a sign of our salvation. Therefore, in the ritual the Church sets apart and makes holy those who are committing themselves to following Christ by signing their bodies with the cross.

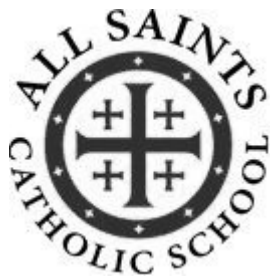
The Bible

In order to learn how to take up the cross of Christ each day of their lives, the catechumens and candidates will need to be nourished by the Word of God. As a gift from the parish community, the bibles they have been given are blessed. In the scriptures they will hear every Sunday at Mass, God speaks, and in the Gospels, Christ proclaims to all those assembled His love and the message of salvation.

Dismissal of the Catechumens

As they are not yet baptized, the catechumens will not participate in the prayers of the faithful (the Creed, the General Intercessions, and the Eucharistic Prayer) which climaxes in Communion. After the homily, the catechumens are sent with a member of the baptized faithful to break open the Word of God and reflect on God’s call in their lives.

As members of the parish community, participating in these rites of initiation should help each of us strengthen our faith journey. Do you remember when you first heard the call of God in your life? What important commitment have you made to your faith and the parish community? How has the cross touched your life? How have the words of the Sacred Scriptures nourished you? These rites allow our parish community to support our Inquirers as they transition to the Period of the Catechumenate. We ask all members of our parish community to keep our candidates and catechumens in thought and prayer as they continue on their journey of faith.

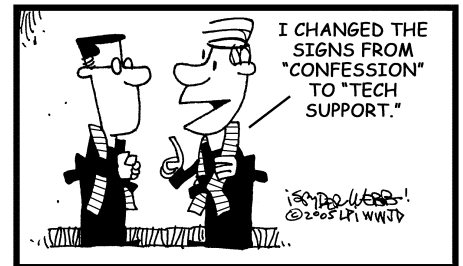

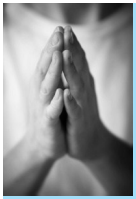

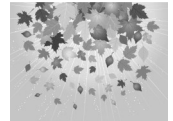
